WHAT IS POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION?

Education that occurs after high school graduation:

Trade, technical, community college, four year college/university

IT IS NOW MORE CRITICAL THAN EVER BEFORE!

Why is it important?

People who earn at least a 2-year degree:

-Live an average of 7 years longer

-Earn at least 50% more

-Are 26% more likely to be very happy!

WHY COLLEGE?

Students:

Know yourself and your personal reasons for attending college.

- What are you most interested in now?
- Where do you hope to be in five years?
- Hopes/dreams?

Parents:

Engage your student in a conversation about college.

- What are you most excited about?
- Concerned about?

COLLEGE 101

9 week course covers:

- College search process
- Components of college applications
- Understanding of college review process
- Financial aid and scholarships

Final portfolio is due by May 15, 2020.

This is a Pass/Fail course and grade appears on your transcript!

AFTER COLLEGE 101, STUDENTS WILL HAVE:

- List of 10 colleges for consideration
- Completed resume
- Completed college application essay
- Identified teachers for recommendations
- SUMMER: Focus on refining list of colleges, visiting, and meaningful summer activity

Features:

- Research colleges and universities; SuperMatch
- Keep track of college applications
- Keep up with college visits at HT
- Search for scholarships

Student

Keep up your grades!

Complete assignments in College 101!

Share your college list with your family and maybe schedule a visit!

Register for and take the ACT in the Spring! Do some test prep! Ask for a waiver if you qualify.

Be proactive. Ask questions, visit with counselor, talk to seniors, attend HT college rep visits.

Parent

Support your child. Encourage them to fully participate in College 101!

Remember, this is their process. Support but don't lead!

Visit colleges with your student. Discuss pros and cons as a family!

Complete the parent brag sheet (blue sheet)!

Reach out to counselor with questions and attend family meeting if possible.
